To MJB Wood Group, Inc. Customers:

Important Notice: California Wood Dust Warnings to Consumers

As you are likely aware, California in 2009 added wood dust to the list under California Proposition 65, The Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 ("Prop 65"), as a substance known to the State of California to cause cancer. Individuals may be exposed to wood dust when wood products are drilled, sawed, machined, or otherwise handled in a manner that will produce wood dust.

MJB Wood Group, Inc. ("MJB") in an effort to provide its customers with continuing education on regulatory matters affecting your business, is providing this notice to make you aware of the new regulation and how it could affect your business and the business of your customers.

According to these new California regulations, no person in the course of doing business, shall knowingly and intentionally expose an individual to the wood dust without first providing a clear and reasonable warning. The warning requirement applies to any person employing 10 or more employees who manufactures, produces, sells, distributes or otherwise transfers a wood product into the stream of commerce in California.

Additionally, The California Attorney General's office has indicated that distributors of wood products have a duty to inform their retail customers of the warning requirement and take reasonable steps to ensure their retail customers are properly providing the warning to the ultimate purchaser of the wood products at retail outlets. Representatives of the California Attorney General's Office have stated that the following warning, if properly displayed at the retail outlet satisfies the clear and reasonable warning requirement of the statute:

The following warning should be displayed at the retail point of sale or display of the wood products so it will be seen by the purchaser of the wood products.

WARNING:

Drilling, sawing, sanding or machining wood products generates wood dust, a substance known to the State of California to cause cancer. Avoid inhaling wood dust or otherwise determine what safeguards or personal protection equipment may be necessary to prevent inhaling wood dust.

To comply with your duties under the Prop 65, you must provide a copy of the warning sign along with an explanatory letter to all of your retail customers in California to inform them of their duties under Prop 65, and you must make reasonable efforts to ensure that retailers are properly posting the warning sign.

We also request that you help MJB to fulfill its duties under the act by also signing and returning the attached Acknowledgement confirming your compliance with Prop 65 via fax or attached to an email.

We sincerely appreciate your time and efforts in reading these requirements, complying with these new regulations and in helping MJB also comply with these new requirements.
